Fees: Only U.S. funds. Payable to **BMCI** and paid online with your entry. Online entries accepted with credit card or electronic check. A 3% online entry processing fee will be added to your bill.

Entries: Entries should be completed at www.HorseShowOffice.com. Alternatively, entries may be mailed or otherwise delivered to BMCI, PO Box 248, Dexter, MI 48130, and must be RECEIVED on or before the closing date. Additional \$25/show/entry fee if not entering online. If using express mail, waive signature. Entries may be delivered in person or by UPS/FedEx to BMCI, 7444 Dexter Ann Arbor Rd. Ste K, Dexter, MI 48130. Entries are accepted on a first come, first served basis and will be processed in the order received until classes are filled. Subsequent entries will be placed on a wait list and notified as times become available. Ties regarding entries received at any time on the same day will be broken by lot at 2:00 PM on May 1st at BMCI's offices at 7444 Dexter Ann Arbor Rd. Ste K, Dexter, MI 48130; any potential entrant in the lots to be drawn has the right to be present in person or by representative. Entries are made as a horse/rider combination. Illegible or incomplete entries cannot be processed until all information is provided. All “no shows” that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show, are subject to a \$23 fee, and times may be filled.

Incomplete Entries: All entries must include a \$15 refundable Incomplete Entry Fee. Fee will be refunded for all entries completed by **Friday, May 3 at 9:00 am**. Entries completed later, but by Tuesday, May 7th at 9:00 am, will be refund \$5 of the incomplete entry fee. *Complete entries include all required signatures, Coggins, vaccinations, music, membership requirements, and payment. Entries with any open issues listed in pre-show notifications are incomplete; only entries that clear all unresolved entry issues by the times above qualify for the full or partial refund of the incomplete entry fee.*

Faxed entries are accepted with a faxed check, Visa, MasterCard, or Discover. **Faxed entries must include check or credit card payment.** Fax entry to (734) 426-3111.

Online entries are accepted at www.HorseShowOffice.com. There is a 3% online entry processing fee for entering online. Online entries may be paid by check or credit card.

Post entries and changes are accepted, if scheduling permits, at \$10 plus normal fee per class. Fee for horse and/or rider change is \$25; per-class \$10 change fee applies to horse/rider changes only if classes are also changed.

Refund Policy: If an entry is cancelled prior to or on the closing date, a full refund is issued less the \$40 office fee (and \$25 mailed/faxed entry fee if applicable). If an entry is cancelled after the closing date, the \$23 USEF fee and any non-member fees, if paid, are refunded. No fees other than USEF fees are refundable after the closing date for any reason, including in the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather or other emergency. Payments are applied to USEF fees after all other entry fees are paid (including the \$23 “no-show” fee if applicable).

USDF Qualifier Fee Refunds: USDF qualifier fees paid for rides that later scratch or no-show will be refunded to the competitor if the competitor has no outstanding balance.

Unpaid Charges: Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance on an entry will be billed for the unpaid balance and a \$25/entry billing fee will be added to the total due.

Proof of membership: USEF and USDF registration is verified electronically if valid membership numbers are provided on entry form. **DO NOT SEND** copies of USEF and USDF memberships, horse recordings, or HIDs. If you do not know your numbers at time of entry, send just the numbers as soon as possible after you enter. Memberships should not be renewed directly with USEF or USDF after Monday before the show as

verification may not be available in time for the show. Renewals done at the show are effective as of the start of the show.

Great American/USDF Qualifying: Q in class description means *Official Qualifying Class for the 2024 Great American/USDF Regional Championships*. Enter Q in addition to Open, AA, or Jr-YR and pay additional \$15 USDF fee to have score entered as Great American/USDF qualifying. An exhibitor riding the same test in more than one class that is designated as Great American/USDF qualifying must specify on entry which score is to be used for the qualifying ride.

CBLM Championship Requirements: For current CBLM Championship requirements, go to www.cblm.org

Opportunity Classes: Horses and riders are permitted to cross-enter into other recognized classes. No USEF or USDF memberships or Horse IDs are required for Opportunity Classes and nonmember fees do not apply. Opportunity-class-only entries are also exempt from the \$23 USEF fee. If an entry cross enters into other recognized classes the requirements and fees that normally correspond to those classes apply.

Test-of-Choice Classes: Specify test on entry.

Para Equestrian Classes: Para equestrian tests are normally run in the size arena specified on the test, but PE tests that specify a 20m x 40m arena may be run in a large arena if USEF rules allow.

Dressage Seat Equitation: Will show at walk, trot, and canter in both directions. The rider's position, seat, and correct use and effect of aids as required by Training and First Level Dressage Tests will be judged.

Awards: Classes will be pinned and ribbons awarded to six places. In case of a tie, awards will remain tied as described in article DR123.3. Management may split classes into separate classes for Open, AA, and/or Jr-YR.

Dressage High Score Awards: Awards at Training-Fourth Levels, FEI levels combined (ex. Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle, Opportunity & YH tests).

Trainers Award: Trainer plus min. two students. Awarded to team with highest average for both days combined. Sign-up in office by 10:00 am on first day competing. Additional details on sign-up form.

M&M Tack Pro Am Team Challenge: One Professional plus two-three Adult Amateurs, Juniors and/or Young Riders make up a Pro-Am Team. Any level may be ridden; levels may be combined. The three highest scores will be averaged to find the Team Score from the Saturday rides of all team members (Intro, MFS, Materiale, Young Horse Tests, Rider Tests and DSE scores will not be included). Team members are considered as a horse/rider combination- if a rider has more than one horse entered in the competition, he/she may ride on more than one team – each team must have unique horse/rider combinations.

High Score AA: To highest scoring AA in any class ex. Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle, Intro & YH tests.

High Score Jr/YR: To highest scoring Jr/YR in any class ex. Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle, Intro & YH tests.

“Newcomer” Award: A special award for a rider competing in his/her first USEF/USDF Dressage Competition.

Dressage High Score Hannoverian: Sponsored by AHS. No AHS membership required. All levels eligible, excluding Intro, Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle & YH tests. Winner receives neck sash.

“Born in the USA” Award: To highest scoring (not highest placing) horse foaled in U.S. Eligibility determined by breeder's address on horse's registration papers or other verification in writing. Excl. Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle, Intro & YH tests. Winner will receive a special award.

ISR/Oldenburg NA: Dressage award to highest scoring eligible ISR/Oldenburg reg horse. Excludes Equitation, Materiale, FS, Intro & YH tests.

KWPN-NA: Dressage award to highest scoring KWPN reg horse. Excludes Equitation, Materiale, FS, Intro & YH tests.

American Warmblood Society & Sporthorse Registry: Dressage award to highest scoring eligible AWSSR reg horse. Excludes Equitation, Materiale, FS, Intro & YH tests.

Stock Horse *Pending*: Dressage award to highest scoring registered Stock Horse (Quarter Horses, Appaloosas, and Paints). Excludes Equitation, Materiale, FS, Intro & YH tests.

Other special awards, including Best Seat and breed awards, to be announced in Official Program.

Breeder's Group Classes: All horses entered in breeder's group class must list what group they are to be show with (only one entry/group pays the fee).

Handlers and Assistant Handlers in DSHB Classes: A **Handler** is any person who holds, walks or trots a horse while it is being judged in the completion area or ring for any In-Hand, Group, or Championship class, except as noted below. An **Assistant Handler** is any person, other than Handler, who holds or walks a horse in competition area during a class, whether or not horse is being judged at the time. An Asst. Handler is permitted only for call-backs after In-Hand or Group Classes, for Championships and for handling non-competing mares/foals which accompany another entry in the competition arena. Asst. Handlers may not show a horse at the trot, (ex. For horses not being judged but accompanying a mare or foal being judged). If not USEF members, are exempted from the USEF Show Pass fee. All Handlers and Asst Handlers must sign original entry form or Handler/Assistant Handler Release prior to entering ring and must have wristbands.

Combining Classes: Management reserves the right to combine Open, AA, and/or Jr-YR classes of the same test into a single class with Open, AA, and/or Jr-YR divisions. In such a case, the individual divisions may still be pinned separately to six places, or the class may be pinned collectively to six places. (If an entrant was in both Open and AA or Open and Jr-YR and the classes are combined, the entrant will automatically be removed from the Open division. The entrant has the option of changing divisions up until one hour prior to the start of the class. In such a case, the entry fee for the dropped division's original class will be refunded.)

Entry Confirmation will be emailed before the show for all entries received by the closing date. Entry must include a valid email address for entry confirmation to be mailed. Add *@HorseShowOffice.com to your approved senders to ensure you receive your confirmation; automated replies from spam blockers are not processed.

Ride Times will be emailed before the show. Include email address for rider, trainer, and/or owner on entry form to have ride times emailed. Ride times also available at www.HorseShowOffice.com. Add *@HorseShowOffice.com to your approved senders to ensure you receive your ride times.

Arenas/Footing: One indoor and one covered ring with composite footing. Three outside 20 x 60 meter sand/crushed granite screening all-weather competition arenas. Large all-weather sand/crushed granite screenings warmup rings. All dressage classes in 20 x 60 meter arenas. Lungeing permitted only in designated areas. All outdoor dressage competition rings and warm-ups have underlying tile drainage systems and all competition and warmup areas are enclosed in perimeter PVC fencing. Show may elect to run some classes in short arena if test is so approved by USEF. **ALL riding, lungeing and exercise is permitted only in designated rings.**

Stabling: Permanent wood stalls with doors approximately 10' x 10'. Half in center aisle barns; half in shed-row with 10' overhang. \$40 per night for each additional night. Each additional night subject to facility and show approval. Shavings available for purchase at show. Those wanting extra bedding at stalls upon arrival must pre-order through Secretary at least 24 hours prior to arrival. Each entry MUST include stabling or parking fee. Upon arrival, an extra copy of the Coggins must be posted on the stall door of each horse for examination by NC State Veterinarian's office inspector. In "stable with" requests, use a name common to all in your group. **NO SMOKING IN STABLING AREAS.**

Coggins Test: Every horse must have on file with the show office a negative Coggins test taken no earlier than 12 months prior to the end of the show. **Negative Coggins must be on file with show management prior to unloading at the show.**

Proof of Vaccination: Every horse must have on file with the show office documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering stables. For vaccines administered by veterinarian: documentation should be provided by veterinarian and include name of horse, name of vaccines, date of vaccine administration. For vaccines administered by person other than veterinarian: documentation should include a receipt of vaccine purchase signed by owner; horse name, serial number and expiration date of vaccine and date of vaccine administration. See GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule. **Proof of Vaccination must be provided to the show office prior to unloading at the show.**

Medical Waste: Sharps containers are located at the end of each barn (and attached to tent poles around the outside of tents in the case of tent stabling). Per USEF rules, competition management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, and their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

Freestyle Music must be provided in digital .mp3 or .wav format and uploaded to your entry or emailed to info@horseshowoffice.com. If emailed, include show name, horse name, rider name, and freestyle level in email. Please provide music at time of entry if possible; music must be received at least two hours prior to the start of the class. Sound checks are available Friday after 4:00 PM and Saturday morning before competition start time or during the lunch break.

Camping: On-site camper hookups available; includes water, 30 amp electrical and sewage. Camper hookups are reserved through Fairgrounds. Completed entries that have requested a camping reservation will receive a link to complete reservation. No camping in stalls at this show.

Food: Food service on grounds (from mid-morning until mid-afternoon) during show. Retail trade concessions also available. Contact Show Manager for information on concession space and program advertising.

US Equestrian Federation General Rules and Regulations

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials, to refuse any entry of any exhibitor for cause, to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his horse for cause, to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his winnings and ribbons for cause, to have horses removed from the grounds for cause, and to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause, all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
