Entries: Entries should be completed at www.HorseShowOffice.com. Alternatively, entries may be mailed or otherwise delivered to BMCI, PO Box 248, Dexter, MI 48130, and must be RECEIVED on or before the closing date. Additional \$25/show/entry fee if not entering online. If using express mail, waive signature. Entries may be delivered in person or by UPS/FedEx to BMCI, 7444 Dexter Ann Arbor Rd. Ste K, Dexter, MI 48130. Entries are accepted on a first come, first served basis and will be processed in the order received until classes are filled. Subsequent entries will be placed on a wait list and notified as times become available. Ties regarding entries received at any time on the same day will be broken by lot at 2:00 PM on February 21st at BMCI's offices at 7444 Dexter Ann Arbor Rd. Ste K, Dexter, MI 48130; any potential entrant in the lots to be

drawn has the right to be present in person or by representative. Entries are made as a horse/rider combination. Illegible or incomplete entries cannot be processed until all information is provided. All “no shows” that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show, are subject to a \$23 fee, and times may be filled.

Incomplete Entries: All entries must include a \$15 refundable Incomplete Entry Fee. Fee will be refunded for all entries completed by **Friday, February 23 at 9:00 am**. Entries completed later, but by Tuesday, February 27th at 9:00 am, will be refund \$5 of the incomplete entry fee. *Complete entries include all required signatures, Coggins, vaccinations, music, membership requirements, and payment. Entries with any open issues listed in pre-show notifications are incomplete; only entries that clear all unresolved entry issues by the times above qualify for the full or partial refund of the incomplete entry fee.*

Faxed entries are accepted with a faxed check, Visa, MasterCard, or Discover. **Faxed entries must include check or credit card payment.** Fax entry to (734) 426-3111.

Online entries are accepted at www.HorseShowOffice.com. There is a 3% online entry processing fee for entering online. Online entries may be paid by check or credit card.

Post entries and changes are accepted, if scheduling permits, at \$10 plus normal fee per class. Fee for horse and/or rider change is \$25; per-class \$10 change fee applies to horse/rider changes only if classes are also changed.

Refund Policy: If an entry is cancelled prior to or on the closing date, a full refund is issued less the \$40 office fee (and \$25 mailed/faxed entry fee if applicable). If an entry is cancelled after the closing date, the \$23 USEF fee and any non-member fees, if paid, are refunded. No fees other than USEF fees are refundable after the closing date for any reason, including in the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather or other emergency. Payments are applied to USEF fees after all other entry fees are paid (including the \$23 “no-show” fee if applicable).

USDF Qualifier Fee Refunds: USDF qualifier fees paid for rides that later scratch or no-show will be refunded to the competitor if the competitor has no outstanding balance.

Unpaid Charges: Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance on an entry will be billed for the unpaid balance and a \$25/entry billing fee will be added to the total due.

Proof of membership: USEF and USDF registration is verified electronically if valid membership numbers are provided on entry form. **DO NOT SEND** copies of USEF and USDF memberships, horse recordings, or HIDs. If you do not know your numbers at time of entry, send just the numbers as soon as possible after you enter. Memberships should not be renewed directly with USEF or USDF after Monday before the show as verification may not be available in time for the show. Renewals done at the show are effective as of the start of the show.

Great American/USDF Qualifying: Q in class description means *Official Qualifying Class for the 2024 Great American/USDF Regional Championships*. Enter Q in addition to Open, AA, or Jr-YR and pay additional \$15 USDF fee to have score entered as Great American/USDF qualifying. An exhibitor riding the same test in more than one class that is designated as Great American/USDF qualifying must specify on entry which score is to be used for the qualifying ride.

NAYC Qualifying: Classes 1FI2U, U25, JT, YT, JI, YI, JF, and YF are official qualifying classes for the FEI North American Youth Championships.

USEF Qualifying:

Classes CT and CI are official qualifiers for 2024 USEF Children Dressage National Championship, Classes PT and PI are official qualifiers for 2024 USEF Pony Rider National Championship, Classes YT, and YI are official qualifiers for 2024 Horsemare Ireland/USEF Young Rider Dressage National Championships, Classes JT and JI are official qualifiers for 2024 Adequan/USEF Junior Dressage National Championships, Classes 1FI2U and U25 are official qualifiers for 2024 Adequan/USEF Young Adult 'Brentina Cup' Dressage National Championship, Classes US4, FEI5, FEI6, FEI7, DHP, and DHG are official qualifiers for 2024 Markel/USEF Young and Developing Horse Dressage Championships, Classes FEI5P, FEI5, FEI6P, FEI6, FEI7P, and FEI7 are official qualifiers for 2024 FEI World Breeding Championships for Young Horses in Dressage (Five, Six, and Seven Years Olds) Championships, Classes 1PU and 2FI1U are official qualifiers for 2024 Neue Schule/USEF Intermediaire I Dressage National Championships, Classes 1GU and 2GPS are official qualifiers for 2024 Neue Schule/USEF Grand Prix Dressage National Championships, and Classes 1PGA, 2PGB and 2PFG are official qualifiers for 2024 Adequan/USEF Para Dressage National Championships.

CBLM Championship Requirements: For current CBLM Championship requirements, go to www.cblm.org

Opportunity Classes: Horses and riders are permitted to cross-enter into other recognized classes. No USEF or USDF memberships or Horse IDs are required for Opportunity Classes and nonmember fees do not apply. Opportunity-class-only entries are also exempt from the \$23 USEF fee. If an entry cross enters into other recognized classes the requirements and fees that normally correspond to those classes apply.

Test-of-Choice Classes: Specify test on entry.

Para Equestrian Classes: Para equestrian tests are normally run in the size arena specified on the test, but PE tests that specify a 20m x 40m arena may be run in a large arena if USEF rules allow.

Dressage Seat Equitation: Will show at walk, trot, and canter in both directions. The rider's position, seat, and correct use and effect of aids as required by Training and First Level Dressage Tests will be judged.

Awards: Classes will be pinned and ribbons awarded to six places. In case of a tie, horses will remain tied as described in article DR123.3. Management may split classes into separate classes for Open, AA, and/or Jr-YR.

Dressage High Score Awards: Awards at Training-Fourth Levels, FEI levels combined (ex. Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle, Opportunity & YH tests).

Trainers Award: Trainer plus min. two students. Awarded to team with highest average for both days combined. Sign-up in office by 10:00 am on first day competing. Additional details on sign-up form.

M&M Tack Pro Am Team Challenge: One Professional plus two-three Adult Amateurs, Juniors and/or Young Riders make up a Pro-Am Team. Any level may be ridden; levels may be combined. The three highest scores will be averaged to find the Team Score from the Saturday rides of all team members (Intro, MFS, Materiale, Young Horse Tests, Rider Tests and DSE scores will not be included). Team members are considered as a horse/rider combination- if a rider has more than one horse entered in the competition, he/she may ride on more than one team – each team must have unique horse/rider combinations.

High Score AA: To highest scoring AA in any class ex. Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle, Intro & YH tests.

High Score Jr/YR: To highest scoring Jr/YR in any class ex. Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle, Intro & YH tests.

“Newcomer” Award: A special award for a rider competing in his/her first USEF/USDF Dressage Competition.

TIP Awards: The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) offers a high score ribbon for Thoroughbreds. Eligible horses must provide T.I.P. numbers to the event secretary with entry. For more information, visit www.tjtip.com. All classes count except Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle, Intro & YH tests.

Dressage High Score Hanoverian: Sponsored by AHS. No AHS membership required. All levels eligible, excluding Intro, Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle & YH tests. Winner receives neck sash.

“Born in the USA” Award: To highest scoring (not highest placing) horse foaled in U.S. Eligibility determined by breeder’s address on horse’s registration papers or other verification in writing. Excl. Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle, Intro & YH tests. Winner will receive a special award.

ISR/Oldenburg NA: Dressage award to highest scoring eligible ISR/Oldenburg reg horse. Excludes Equitation, Materiale, FS, Intro & YH tests.

KWPN-NA: Dressage award to highest scoring KWPN reg horse. Excludes Equitation, Materiale, FS, Intro & YH tests.

American Warmblood Society & Sporthorse Registry: Dressage award to highest scoring eligible AWSSR reg horse. Excludes Equitation, Materiale, FS, Intro & YH tests.

Stock Horse: Dressage award to highest scoring registered Stock Horse (Quarter Horses, Appaloosas, and Paints). Excludes Equitation, Materiale, FS, Intro & YH tests.

Other special awards, including Best Seat and breed awards, to be announced in Official Program.

Combining Classes: Management reserves the right to combine Open, AA, and/or Jr-YR classes of the same test into a single class with Open, AA, and/or Jr-YR divisions. In such a case, the individual divisions may still be pinned separately to six places, or the

class may be pinned collectively to six places. (If an entrant was in both Open and AA or Open and Jr-YR and the classes are combined, the entrant will automatically be removed from the Open division. The entrant has the option of changing divisions up until one hour prior to the start of the class. In such a case, the entry fee for the dropped division’s original class will be refunded.)

Entry Confirmation will be emailed before the show for all entries received by the closing date. Entry must include a valid email address for entry confirmation to be mailed. Add *@HorseShowOffice.com to your approved senders to ensure you receive your confirmation; automated replies from spam blockers are not processed.

Ride Times will be emailed before the show. Include email address for rider, trainer, and/or owner on entry form to have ride times emailed. Ride times also available at www.HorseShowOffice.com. Add *@HorseShowOffice.com to your approved senders to ensure you receive your ride times.

Arenas/Footings: One indoor and one covered ring with composite footing. Three outside 20 x 60 meter sand/crushed granite screening all-weather competition arenas. Large all-weather sand/crushed granite screenings warmup rings. All dressage classes in 20 x 60 meter arenas. Lungeing permitted only in designated areas. All outdoor dressage competition rings and warm-ups have underlying tile drainage systems and all competition and warmup areas are enclosed in perimeter PVC fencing. Show may elect to run some classes in short arena if test is so approved by USEF. **ALL riding, lungeing and exercise is permitted only in designated rings.**

Stabling: Permanent wood stalls with doors approximately 10’ x 10’. Half in center aisle barns; half in shed-row with 10’ overhang. \$40 per night for each additional night. Each additional night subject to facility and show approval. Shavings available for purchase at show. Those wanting extra bedding at stalls upon arrival must pre-order through Secretary at least 24 hours prior to arrival. Each entry MUST include stabling or parking fee. Upon arrival, an extra copy of the Coggins must be posted on the stall door of each horse for examination by NC State Veterinarian’s office inspector. In “stable with” requests, use a name common to all in your group. **NO SMOKING IN STABLING AREAS.**

Coggins Test: Every horse must have on file with the show office a negative Coggins test taken no earlier than 12 months prior to the end of the show. **Negative Coggins must be on file with show management prior to unloading at the show.**

Proof of Vaccination: Every horse must have on file with the show office documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering stables. For vaccines administered by veterinarian: documentation should be provided by veterinarian and include name of horse, name of vaccines, date of vaccine administration. For vaccines administered by person other than veterinarian: documentation should include a receipt of vaccine purchase signed by owner; horse name, serial number and expiration date of vaccine and date of vaccine administration. See GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule. **Proof of Vaccination must be provided to the show office prior to unloading at the show.**

Medical Waste: Sharps containers are located at the end of each barn (and attached to tent poles around the outside of tents in the case of tent stabling). Per USEF rules, competition management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, and their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

Freestyle Music must be provided in digital .mp3 or .wav format and uploaded to your entry or emailed to info@horseshowoffice.com. If emailed, include show name, horse name, rider name, and freestyle level in email. Please provide music at time of entry if

A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2024 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division.

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B.
